Yes. Recently I was snorkeling in John U. Lloyd Beach State Park at one of the best shore dives that Broward has to offer (The Jax) & witnessed relentless destruction of the habitat. Why is this area not a marine sanctuary or protected area? On the morning of the 4th of July I witnessed one spearfisherman collecting every size of juvenile fish for the aquarium trade. He had 2 catch buckets of different sizes with nets & was collecting every juvenile fish in sight. He also had a pneumatic speargun tied to a dive flag that dragged across the reef which he used to kill larger fish. To top it off he was standing on the reef in his large free diving fins to get the leverage to get into every crevice to get the fish, killing any coral that exists there. Every time I see this in the park I wonder how the reef can possibly survive such pillage. We kill lionfish for gobbling up juvenile fish and yet humans are allowed to do it every day to fill aquariums or sell for the aquarium trade. Why is at least a state park not protected from these destructive activities? The people who do this enter the park from the public parking lot at Dania Beach & walk down the beach, they don't even pay for park fees.
